Test 1

Use boarded example to demo.

MFP

After 4 – *Santiago is the largest city in Chile.*

- Compared to other cities in Chile, is Santiago large? (Yes)
- Is it large compared to some cities in Chile, or all of them? (All of them.)

After 7 – *Its streets weren't as clean as they are today.*

- Were the streets clean in the past? (No)
- Are they clean now? (Yes; or improved)

After 8 – *Public transport around the city is much better...*

- Do you prefer the public transport in the past, or now? (Now)

– *Bicycling is a lot more popular these days...*

- Do the same number of people ride bicycles now as in the past? (No) Do more or fewer people ride them now? (More)

Form

With your partner, try to figure out a rule for which words go in which box. Why do these use more/most and these use er/est? Discuss.

> Three or more syllables: more/most; one: er/est; two, it depends (usually if it ends in an ee sound, er/est, otherwise more/most).

What do we notice about this one (**better**)? (Doesn't follow the rule.)

> "good" (and bad) is a bit strange and don't follow the rule.
